Habitat Site Visit

During Jean and John Knight's
January-February Puerto Rican trip, they met
with Amanda Silva and Blanchy Colón of
Habitat for Humanity of Puerto Rico. The
current rehab project in Caguas, PR is a ten
family apartment building. Two apartments
are designated for handicapped accessibility.
Habitat is currently awaiting approval of city
permits before they can start some of the
remaining work. In the meantime, they're
engaged with family applicants in the
eligibility determination process. Habitat of
Puerto Rico is one of the entities Hermandad
supports.

Affordable housing stands as a great challenge in Puerto Rico. This past November Hermandad made their second annual donation to Habitat for Humanity of Puerto Rico. We appreciate the commitment and work of all the Habitat staff and volunteers. Hermandad celebrates Habitat's work in Caguas and throughout the island. In April, Hermandad awarded a \$1,500 check to Colegio de Bautista de Caguas. Our gift will assist two science students who will attend the International Science Fair in Columbus, Ohio from May 10-16, 2025 in Columbus

Axel Roman and Gabriela Hernández will represent Puerto Rico in the category of Environmental Engineering. Their project is Regolith Bioremediation for the Cultivation of Medicago sativa, which proposes the use of fungi to prepare and remove toxins from the soil and cultivate alfalfa. In the future, they wish to help farmers clean and prepare the land to grow more food in Puerto Rico.

We celebrate their achievements and are grateful we have an opportunity to help as they journey to the International Science Fair.

He has received Adult Achievement Awards from the Peabody Preparatory multiple times. David performs in the Adult Continuing Education Recitals at Peabody. Additionally, he has played the piano at nursing homes, holiday parties, weddings, and fundraisers including one benefiting Puerto Rico after Hurricane Maria.

Kathleen is a second year vocal major at the Peabody Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University, in the studio of Ah Young Hong. She has been performing since the age of 6, and has a passion for uplifting people through the arts.
