“Así Suena Puerto Rico”

Our group titled the December 2025 concert “Así Suena Puerto Rico” (“That’s what Puerto Rico sounds like”). This concert raises funds for the Jack and Eunice Knight Memorial Fund for Puerto Rican youth. Hermandad has awarded scholarships, supported scouting efforts, and helped pay expenses for science fair winners to attend the International Science Fair through this fund.

Hermandad presented their third annual traditional Puerto Rican Christmas music concert on Saturday, December 6, 2025. Our musicians included Catherine Fries-Sierra (Vocals and Narration), Orlando Cotto (Percussion and Vocals), Ernesto Rivera (Percussion), and Santiago (Tito) Padilla (keyboard and vocals). Due to a case of laryngitis, Luis Rivera was unable to be with us this year. Tito Padilla provided vocals in his place. Hermandad is grateful for the multitalented Tito Padilla and look forward to Luis Rivera’s return in December.

December 2025 Trip

For the first time, Jean and John visited Puerto Rico in December. Two days after our Hermandad, “Así Suena Puerto Rico” fundraiser Jean and John boarded the plane for San Juan.

Their primary reason for going in December centered on receiving an invitation from the National Federation of the Blind of Puerto Rico to attend their annual convention in Caguas. Once on the island, Jean and John received multiple invitations including a certificate ceremony at C3Tec, a church Christmas party and a Trulla. They also presented Corporación Milagros del Amor (CorMA) with a donation of \$1,000.

At C3Tec’s certificate ceremony, we celebrated participants’ completion a two month, twice weekly, robotics and programing workshop. As part of the program, participants presented a video game they had created. First, one of their parents would attempt to play the video game. Then, the video game creator showed how to play it and win! Each participant also received a small robot at the ceremony.

Jean and John met the seven scholarship recipients ranging from age 10 to their early teens that included boys and girls. Each scholarship was valued at \$391 per person.

On Friday, Jean and John attended a Trulla sponsored by Primera Iglesia Bautista de Caguas. A Trulla is like Christmas caroling Puerto Rican style. The group visited three homes singing traditional Puerto Rican songs. At the last home, they enjoyed soup and bread as is part of the tradition. They also had an opportunity to attend some of the church's Christmas party Saturday afternoon before preparing to attend a banquet that night.

At the Annual Convention of the National Federation of the Blind of Puerto Rico, they attended meetings, workshops and Saturday's banquet. Jean and John received recognition for Hermandad's continued support for the National Federation of the Blind of Puerto Rico.

January to March Puerto Rico Trip 2026

At the close of the program, Jean and John presented Aleyda, president of the National Federation of the Blind of Puerto Rico, with a bouquet of flowers and a \$3,000 donation.

They also surprised Gladys Rodriguez, Executive Director of Corporación Milagros del Amor (CorMA) with two gifts. CorMA received the first gift of \$1,000 from Hermandad’s new “Reverend John & Mrs. Jean Knight Endowment Fund for Puerto Rico.” John and Jean designed this to be an active endowment where Hermandad builds and uses funds simultaneously. With this gift for the people of Puerto Rico, they hope Hermandad’s work will continue long after they are gone. Then, John and Jean also presented Gladys with a check to CorMA in the amount of \$2,000.

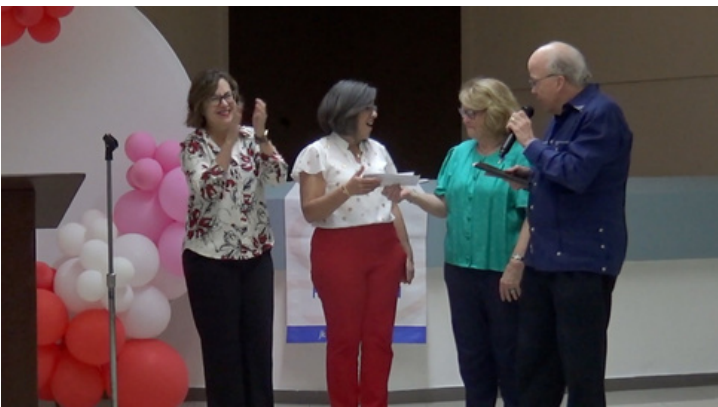

He has received Adult Achievement Awards from the Peabody Preparatory multiple times. David performs in the Adult Continuing Education Recitals at Peabody. Additionally, he has played the piano at nursing homes, holiday parties, weddings, and fundraisers including one benefiting Puerto Rico after Hurricane Maria. This year David introduced Hermandad to pianist Joseph Bowens who will be our third performer in our "A Celebration of Spring" Recital.



Vocalist Kathleen Hackett is a third year vocal major at the Peabody Conservatory of Johns Hopkins University, in the studio of Ah Young Hong. She has been performing since the age of 6, and has a passion for uplifting people through the arts. Previous credits include: Les Misérables (Gavroche), A Pirates Life for Me (Dandy), The Screwtape Letters, Carousel, Oliver! (The Artful Dodger), Fiddler on the Roof (Yenta the Matchmaker), The King and I (Anna Leonowens), The Crucible (Mary Warren), My Fair Lady (Mrs. Higgins), Godspell (Celisse), Camelot, Annie (Miss Hannigan), The Sound of Music (Reverend Mother), as well as participating in the St. Philomena Apostolate choir for 6 years, and the Peabody Hopkins Community choir.



Pianist Joseph Bowens trained at Peabody Preparatory under the guidance of Dr. Hyun-Sook Park and later expanded into jazz studies with Blake Meister.

Continuing his artistic growth, Joseph studied privately in New York City with Grammy-nominated jazz pianist Eldar Djangirov, an experience that profoundly influenced his musical perspective and performance approach.

As a composer and producer, he enjoys exploring and blending a wide range of genres, including jazz, classical, lo-fi, hip-hop, soul, and progressive rock. "My work reflects a passion for musical versatility, expressive storytelling, and pushing creative boundaries across styles."
